La La Land Friday 22nd September 2017, 7.30pm



Comedy/drama/musical: The story of Mia, an aspiring actress, and Sebastian, a dedicated jazz musician, struggling to make ends meet while pursuing their dreams in a city known for destroying hope and breaking hearts. With modern day Los Angeles as the backdrop, this musical about everyday life explores what is more important: a once-in-a-lifetime love or the spotlight. *Cert 12A - 2 hrs 8 mins* 

#### Eye in the Sky Friday 13th October 2017, 7.30pm



Drama/thriller: Colonel Katherine Powell is a UK based military officer in command of a top secret drone operation to capture terrorists in Kenya. Through remote surveillance and on-the-ground intelligence, Powell discovers the targets are planning a suicide bombing and the mission escalates from "capture" to "kill". But as the pilot is about to engage, a nine

year old girl enters the kill zone, triggering an international dispute, which reaches the highest levels of US and British government. The film explores the moral, political and personal implications of modern warfare. *Cert 15 - 1 hr 41 mins* 

#### Moonlight Friday 10th November 2017, 7.30pm



Drama: A young, African-American, gay man deals with his dysfunctional home life and comes of age in Miami during the "War on Drugs" era. The story of his struggle to find himself is told across three defining chapters in his life, as he experiences the ecstasy, pain, and beauty of falling in love whilst grappling with his own sexuality. *Cert 15 - 1 hr 51 mins* 

Eagle Huntress Friday 8th December 2017, 7.30pm

Documentary: A spellbinding documentary which follows Aisholpan, a 13 year old nomadic Mongolian girl who is fighting to become the first female eagle hunter in twelve generations of her Kazakh family. Through breathtaking aerial cinematography and intimate vérité footage, the film captures



her personal journey, whilst also addressing universal themes of female empowerment, the natural world, coming of age and the onset of modernity. *Cert U* - 1 *hr* 27 *mins* 

#### Lion Friday 12th January 2018, 7.30pm



Drama: Based on the true story of Saroo Brierley who, at the age of 5, was separated from his family in India as he fell asleep on a train and woke up 150km away from home. Saroo was later adopted by an Australian couple and after 25 years, he began searching for his Indian family. *Cert PG - 1 hr 58 mins* 

Their Finest Friday 16th February 2018, 7.30pm



Comedy/drama: In 1940, a married woman and a screen writer develop a growing attraction while working together on a propaganda film about the evacuation of Allied troops from Dunkirk, France. In the face of these challenges, and while the Blitz rages around them, they share a hope to contribute something meaningful in this time of war and in their own lives. *Cert 12A - 1 hr 57 mins* 

#### Hidden Figures Friday 16th March 2018, 7.30pm



Drama/History: As the United States raced against Russia to put a man in space, NASA found untapped talent in a group of African-American female mathematicians who served as the brains behind one of the greatest operations in U S history. Based on the true life stories of three of these women, known as "human computers", we follow their calculations which helped launch astronaut John Glenn into orbit, and guaranteed his safe return. #### Hunt for the Wilderpeople Friday 13th April 2018, 7.30pm



Adventure/comedy: Raised on hip-hop and foster care, defiant city kid Ricky gets a fresh start in the New Zealand countryside. He quickly finds himself at home with his new foster family: the loving Aunt Bella, the cantankerous Uncle Hec, and dog Tupac. But when tragedy strikes that threatens to ship Ricky to another home, both he and Hec go on the run in the bush - and a national manhunt ensues. *Cert PG - 1 hr 41 mins*
