
The Shape of Water Friday 21st September 2018, 7.30pm



Drama/Thriller. Set in a high-security government lab in 1962 Baltimore, the story follows the life of Elisa, a mute cleaning lady who discovers the lab's classified secret -- a mysterious, scaled water-creature from South America. As Elisa develops a unique bond with her new friend, she realises that its fate and very survival lies in the hands of a hostile government agent and a marine biologist.

A very different and beautifully filmed love story!

Hotel Salvation Friday 12th October 2018, 7.30pm



Indian comedy/drama. Faced with his father's untimely and bizarre demand to go and die in the holy city of Varanasi and attain salvation, a son is left with no choice but to embark on this journey.
Less a story of death than of life and relationships!

Detroit Friday 9th November 2018, 7.30pm



Police/drama/history: Detroit is a 2017 film, based on the Algiers Motel incident during Detroit's 1967 12th Street Riot. Two days after riots and civil unrest in the city of Detroit, a report of gunshots prompts police and army forces to search and seize an annex of the nearby Algiers Motel. A group of rogue police officers respond to a complaint with retribution rather than justice. The film follows both the night's incidents and the later lives of those involved.

Film Stars Don't Die in Liverpool. Friday 7th December 2018, 7.30pm



Drama/romance: Based on a true story, the film follows the playful but passionate relationship between a youthful Liverpudlian and an older eccentric American actress Gloria Grahame. What starts as a vibrant affair between a legendary femme fatale and her young lover quickly grows into a deeper relationship.
In 1978, she returns uninvited to her former lover's family home in Liverpool as serious illness strikes.

Three Billboards Outside Ebbing, Missouri Friday 11th January 2019, 7.30pm



Tragedy: In small town white working-class America, a hard-nosed mother is seeking justice for her murdered daughter. With no arrests after seven months, Mildred puts up three roadside billboards to goad the police chief into action. But the law - and especially the hot-headed deputy - doesn't take kindly to the provocation; and the townsfolk are on their side. However Mildred doesn't care about ruffling a few feathers. Possibly based on a true story.

On Chesil Beach Friday 15th February 2019 7.30pm

Drama/romance: On Chesil Beach is a 2017 film adaptation of Ian



McEwan's 2007 Booker Prize-nominated novella.
Set in 1962, a young couple find their idyllic romance colliding with issues of sexual freedom and societal pressure, leading to an awkward and life-changing wedding night. Beautifully and sensitively shot on location in Dorset.

Comedy/drama: Set in small town America, Marion McPherson, a nurse, works tirelessly to keep her family afloat after her husband loses his job. She also maintains a turbulent bond with a teenage daughter who is just like her: loving, strong-willed and deeply opinionated. A coming of age story with a feel-good factor!

Stop-motion animation: Set in near-future dystopian Japan, it was conceived and directed by Wes Andersen.
After all the canine pets of Megasaki City are exiled to a vast garbage-dump called Trash Island, 12-year-old Atari sets off alone in a miniature Junior-Turbo Prop and flies across the river in search of his bodyguard-dog, Spots. There, with the assistance of a pack of newly-found mongrel friends, he begins an epic journey that will decide the fate and future of the entire Prefecture.
